On March 15, Eric Lamaze won the \$35,000 CSI3* Equinimity WEF Challenge Cup Round 10 aboard Chesney, marking the Canadian Olympic champion's third WEF Challenge Cup win of the season and his record 28th WEF Challenge Cup career victory. Previously tied with three-time U.S. Olympic medalist McLain Ward for the most WEF Challenge Cup wins at 27 apiece, Eric now sits alone at the top of the leaderboard. To earn his most recent victory, Eric and Chesney, an 11-year-old Dutch Warmblood gelding owned by Artisan Farms, mastered the course set by Michel Vaillancourt, the only person other than Eric to win an individual Olympic medal for Canada.
