Sir's offspring earned 10,681 points in dressage competitions throughout the year, more than 4,000 points ahead of the second place stallion, Contango, Preferent, who is also owned by Iron Spring. Sir's impressive achievement was made possible by 72 sons and daughters earning points, including 27 offspring competing at FEI, with four at grand prix. Rounding out the remarkable year for the Iron Spring stallions, UB40, Keur,

finished third among more than 800 ranked dressage sires in 2018. All three ISF stallions were also ranked in the Top 100 FEI Dressage Sires by the World Breeding Federation for Sport Horses.

For the better part of five decades, it was rare to not be greeted by Kiki Umla at the head of hospitality at the nation's top horse shows. A USEF steward, hostess, friend, leader, resource and so much more was lost when Kiki passed away from illness in 2016. To honor Kiki, the Lake Placid Horse Show Association is set to open the Kiki Umla Ring to riders at the Lake Placid Horse Show's 50th anniversary in July 2019. The undertaking, which expands one of the riding arenas by 11,000 square feet - creating a 28,000 square-foot riding space with new and improved footing - was the brainchild of LPHS Association Chairman Philip Richter. "Kiki was known to be the steward of that ring back there," he said. "There will be a beautiful sign there that will memorialize her for many years to come."

The Lake Placid Horse Show Organization has raised more than \$100,000 to fund the arena, but it is seeking donations to reach its \$150,000 fundraising goal to make the ring a reality. The Kiki Umla Ring will be announced at a cocktail reception preceding the 2019 Lake Placid Horse Show, where Philip and those in attendance will "raise a glass to Kiki." "Unequivocally, I believe she would be very happy with this whole project," Philip said. "I think she would find the whole idea appropriate, and it feels good to know that she would have approved."
