

Days End Farm Horse Rescue to Host Fall Festival in Woodbine, MD

Woodbine, MD – The public is invited to join Days End Farm Horse Rescue (DEFHR) in Woodbine, MD, for two days of fun during the non-profit organization's Fall Festival Kick-Off Concert on Friday, September 27, and the DEFHR Fall Festival and 30th Anniversary Celebration on Saturday, September 28.

Both events will be held at 1372 Woodbine Road in Woodbine, MD, with the festivities kicking off at 6 p.m. on Friday evening, with live music from The 19th Street Band beginning at 7 p.m.

In addition to enjoying a concert under the stars, Friday night guests can play corn hole and

giant Jenga and join DEFHR in saying "cheers to 30 years" with the opening of DEFHR's Hops for Horses Beer Garden, which will be serving seasonal brews to pair with food from a local food truck available onsite. Admission for Friday night's event is \$5 per person at the gate, with proceeds going to DEFHR's equine rehabilitation fund.

The fun will continue on Saturday when the 2019 Fall Festival gets underway beginning at 11 a.m. This year's edition of the annual Fall Festival will celebrate DEFHR's 30th anniversary and will feature games, a kids' zone, pony rides, a petting zoo, face painting, ven-

dors, arena demos and exhibitions, the Hops for Horses Beer Garden, and much more.

Beginning at 12 p.m., guests will enjoy the sounds of rock, funk, and soul with live music from the 10-piece band The Rebels.

Admission for Saturday's Fall Festival is \$2, with children 12 and under admitted free. Parking is \$2, with proceeds from admission going to the rescue and rehabilitation of horses at DEFHR and parking proceeds going to local Boy and Girl Scout Troops.

September 1, 2019 — Unionville, PA — Beginning with renowned three-day eventing rider Bruce Davidson, organizers of the Plantation Field International CCI4-S, September 19-22, 2019 plan to honor exceptional local equestrians each year at Sunday brunch during the event. The 2019 brunch, presented by The National Bank of Malvern, will be open to those who already hold a sponsor ticket, or tickets are available for purchase and will take place in the VIP area overlooking the show jumping arena.

With more than 100 years as home to Mr. Stewart's Cheshire Fox Hounds, the Unionville area is steeped in equestrian history. It has long been an equestrian destination and



home to top riders and trainers from a variety of equine disciplines including eventing, dressage, show jumping, racing and fox hunting.

Two individuals, Ann Hambleton and Lucy Gliters, compiled a list of accomplished members of the Unionville equine community. Each year, someone from this list will be honored at the Plantation Field International. The first recipient will be two-time World Champion, five-time

Olympian and U.S. Eventing Association Hall of Fame legend Bruce Davidson.

Denis Glaccum, President of Plantation Field Equestrian Events, Inc. said, "This list includes 51 appearances in Olympic, Pan American and World Championship competitions by local individuals and their horses. The list continues with 13 champion steeplechase jockeys and two champion steeplechase

trainers, and 29 Eclipse awards won by horses training on Unionville hills. The most prestigious timber race in the world, The Maryland Hunt Cup, has seen 36 winners train in Unionville."

Glaccum added, "As with any list there is always the chance someone is left off by mistake. We apologize in advance. There is also the temptation to expand and include the great racehorses with Unionville connections. However, our

recognition is on the sport horse activities in Unionville."
