## The Chronicle of the Horse Max Amaya wakes up seven days a week with the same level of drive and intensity that saw him

dedicate his life to horses 28 years ago. "Every day I wake up and I say, 'I don't want to fail. I don't want to not be able to achieve this. I want this horse to be well. I want this horse to do good. I want this rider to succeed," said Amaya.



"In my personal space, I can only be in charge of my actions not to fail. When I'm dealing with riders and

students, not only do I have to try to not fail myself, but also, I have to persuade that person not to give up in order to not fail. So, it's challenging, but it's what keeps me going."

Amaya founded the Colts Neck, New Jersey, and Wellington, Florida-based Stonehenge Farm in 2006.

He trains the next generation of jumper and equitation riders, and he's been instrumental in the development of riders like Brianne Goutal, Jessica Springsteen and TJ O'Mara.






