Tracy Fenney (USA) pulled out another win in the \$75,000 Coca-Cola Beverages Florida Grand Prix on Saturday, August 14, during the final week of the World Equestrian Center – Ocala Summer Series. As the second-to-last pair to jump off, Fenney and MTM Apple, a 16-year-old Selle Francais gelding owned by MTM Farm, topped an incredible 18 clear rounds and 11 double-clear efforts to take the final grand prix win of the series.

An additional \$5,000 was awarded to Sharn Wordley (NZL) and Casper, who jumped the fastest four-fault round of Saturday night's \$75,000 Coca-Cola Beverages Florida Grand Prix, in 73.975 seconds. The non-award winning entry that received the Luck of the Draw \$5,000 prize was Justine Dutton (GBR) with Ravello.

"I thought the first round course was set very well," Toering said. "All of the lines flowed on a nice gallop, which is perfect for In The Black because he has such a huge step."

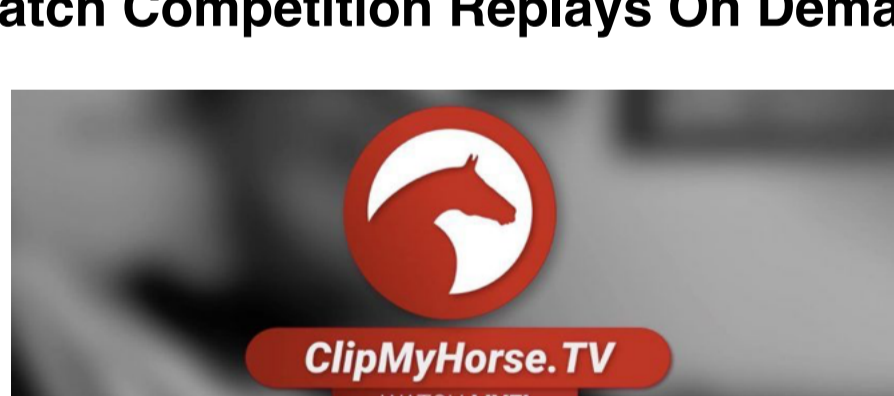
Melissa Donnelly and Corlando 49 took their second win in the \$12,500 WEC – Ohio 3'6"-3'9" Hunter Derby on Friday, August 13, the final Derby Friday of the series. Donnelly and the 15-year-old Holsteiner gelding owned by Just A Folly Farm received a total score of 170.5 for the win.

"The plan for this class was to show off his best features," Donnelly said. "He turns really well and really sharp. He can slice and dice a jump really easily. We looked for the places where we could show him off best in the sharp turns and gallop. His routine beforehand is really simple. He definitely knows when it is Derby Friday!"

Winning the \$10,000 WEC – Ohio Hunter Derby 3' Open was David Beisel and Davidson, while Sarah L. Berkowitz and Exosant earned first place in the \$10,000 WEC – Ohio Hunter Derby Non-Pro.
