Aaron Vale and Elusive Claim Victory in the \$75,000 Golden Ocala Golf and Equestrian Club Grand Prix at WEC – Ocala

Aaron Vale (USA) piloted Elusive, owned by Thinks Like A Horse, to the blue ribbon in the \$75,000 Golden Ocala Golf and Equestrian Club Grand Prix at World Equestrian Center – Ocala during the Winter Spectacular I show in Ocala, FL, on Saturday, January 8, 2022. Vale and the 13-year-old Dutch Warmblood gelding were the first of six combinations to return to the jump-off and remained at the top of the leaderboard after stopping the timers at 49.906 seconds.

"Normally, I am really on the numbers, but in this jump-off the jumps were so far apart, and I was a little pressed for time, so I wasn't able to walk the strides in the jump-off like I normally do," explained Vale. "My plan was to just go fast and not pump the brakes."

Lauren Balcomb (AUS) and her own Verdini D'Houtveld Z were the only other pair to jump double clear and finished in second place. Third place honors went to Sharn Wordley (NZL) and Valentine Car, owned by Fernando Cardenas.

Amanda Steege rode Cheryl Olsten's Lafitte de Muze to victory in the \$20,000 WEC – Ocala 3'6"-3'9" Hunter Derby on Friday, January 7. Steege and the 10year-old Belgian Warmblood gelding secured the win with an 11-point lead in the class. The pair received a first-round score of 96 and a handy round score of 99 for an impressive overall score of 195.

"The handy was great," explained Steege. "It really had an abundance of options, which was very fun. Currently, I am really trying to practice riding with a bit more pace and to be as handy as I can while incorporating every high option."

Timothy Maddrix and Hudson Meadows Racing's The Irish captured the win in the \$15,000 WEC – Ocala 3' Open Derby. Dorothy Douglas piloted Abigail Davenport's MTM Exceptional to second place in the class.

Kevin McCarthy (IRL) and his own Catch a Star HSS once again proved unbeatable in the \$30,000 World Equestrian Center – Wilmington Grand Prix on Saturday, January 8, during the Winter IV Show. McCarthy and the 11year-old Swedish Warmblood mare were one of 10 combinations that qualified for the jump-off. The pair stopped the timers at 40.769 seconds to take home the blue ribbon.

"We really do go out there and try to win each and every time," described McCarthy. "The course design was excellent and a really fun jump-off track. There were many good riders in the class tonight, which always makes you want to work harder. I had to be on my 'A' game for sure. This is our third grand prix win in a row, and I owe it to my great mare."

Charlotte Clark rode Kinsella to a second-place finish in the class with a time of 42.183 seconds. Lisa Goldman-Smolen and Sovereign earned third place after stopping the clock at 43.645 seconds.


