## Will Simpson Earns the Top Prize in the \$75,000 Stella Artois Grand Prix at WEC – Ocala

Will Simpson (USA) and Whoop De Doo, owned by Coxe Horses LLC, topped a 10-horse jump-off to take the win in the \$75,000 Stella Artois Grand Prix, brought to you by Tri-Eagle Sales at World Equestrian Center – Ocala during the Winter Spectacular II show in Ocala, FL, on Saturday, January 15, 2022. Manuel Esparza (MEX) designed two technical tracks for the 39 horse-and-rider combinations entered in the class. Simpson and the 11-year-old Warmblood mare completed the first course with ease and stopped the timers at 38.795 seconds in the competitive jump-off to earn the victory.

"Everyone from my team has been working so hard, so it's great to pull out a win today," described Simpson. "It's a team effort, and we share a great camaraderie at the barn. I don't know what I would do without them. I am also super proud of Whoopy today. I think she is really starting to come into her own."

Just after Simpson was Rodrigo Pessoa (BRA) and Artemis Equestrian Farm LLC's Major Tom in 40.490 seconds. Pessoa also claimed third place with Artemis Equestrian Farm LLC's Quality FZ in a time of 41.162 seconds.

Holly Shepherd piloted Debbie Holland's Tybee to the blue ribbon in the \$20,000 WEC – Ocala 3'6"-3'9" Hunter Derby on Friday, January 14. The 15-year-old Hanoverian gelding impressed the judges with his scopey jump to earn a score of 86 in the first round. Shepherd and Tybee were the second to last pair to return for the handy round and earned a score of 90 to top the leaderboard.

"He's one of the best hunters I've ever ridden," explained Shepherd. "He really likes jumping bigger jumps, so I am always anxious to jump the high options. Sometimes I wish the jumps were bigger. He doesn't really get to show off too much when they are on the smaller side."

Hillary Johnson rode Copper Fox LLC's Suede to victory in the \$15,000 WEC – Ocala 3' Open Hunter Derby. Dorothy Douglas claimed second place aboard Abigail Davenport's MTM Exceptional.

"The course was nice, and the jump-off was a lot of fun," described McCarthy. "It was challenging in all of the right ways. My horse performed well but we had to stay on top of our 'A' game because there were many good riders trailing us."

This week's Welcome Stake winners, Paul Halpern and Esra, owned by Vanessa Lee, claimed second place with a time of 35.478 seconds. Katia Manuel-Adams piloted her own ERP Van <u>www.Olland.biz</u> to third place honors.



## Melissa Donnelly and Corlando 49 Win the \$5,000 WEC – Wilmington Open Hunter Derby



Melissa Donnelly and Elizabeth Becker's Corlando 49 bested a field of 13 entries to take top honors in the \$5,000 WEC -Wilmington 3' Open Hunter Derby on Friday, January 14. Donnelly and the 16vear-old Holsteiner navigated the first round with ease to earn a score of 89. The pair did not disappoint in the handy round and scored a 91 for a total score of 180. Donnelly claimed the top three ribbons in the class, earning second place on Addison Mae King's Juan Colorado and third place with Breathless, owned by Sarah Barnes.

"The course was lovely, and the long bending lines suited the young horses well," explained Donnelly. "The challenges were probably the short turns in the corners, which were trickier for a couple of them. Overall, it was great, and Cory (Corlando 49) was on his 'A' game!"
