- \$15,000 1.40m Jumper Stake (Sunday Morning)

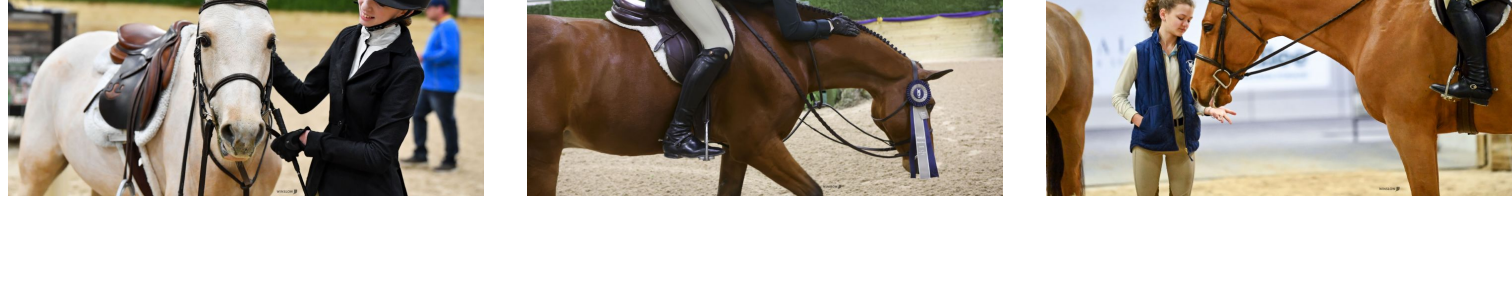
All entry fees collected for the Grand Prix will go to David.
