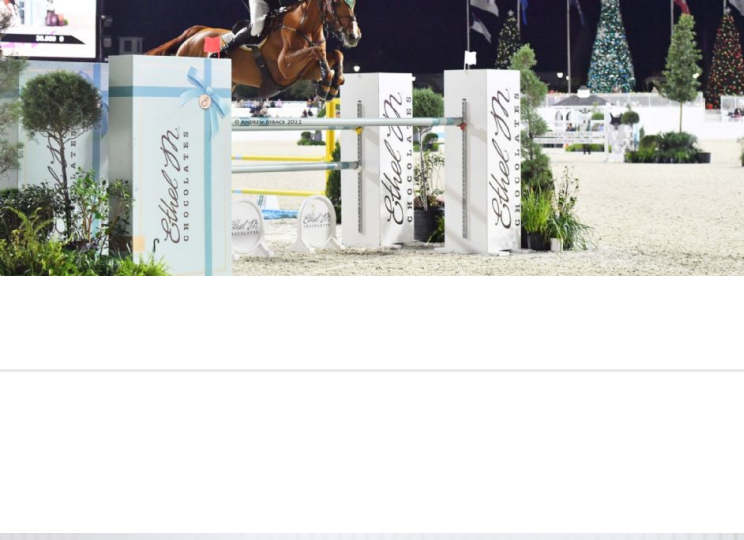

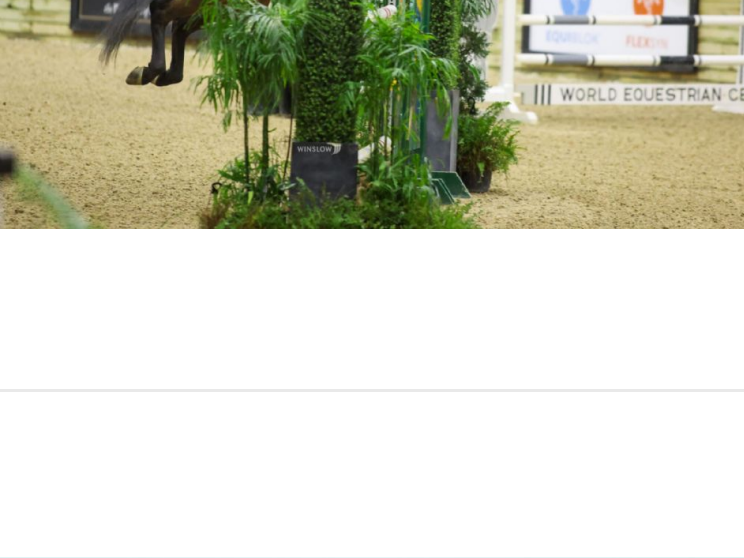
World Equestrian Center Highlights From Ocala November Fall II and Wilmington Midwest Indoors II

“I always knew Blue Movie was going to be special ever since she was a foal. It took me a very long time to figure her out but my patience has paid off. She has taken me all around the world and been a life-changing horse for me.”

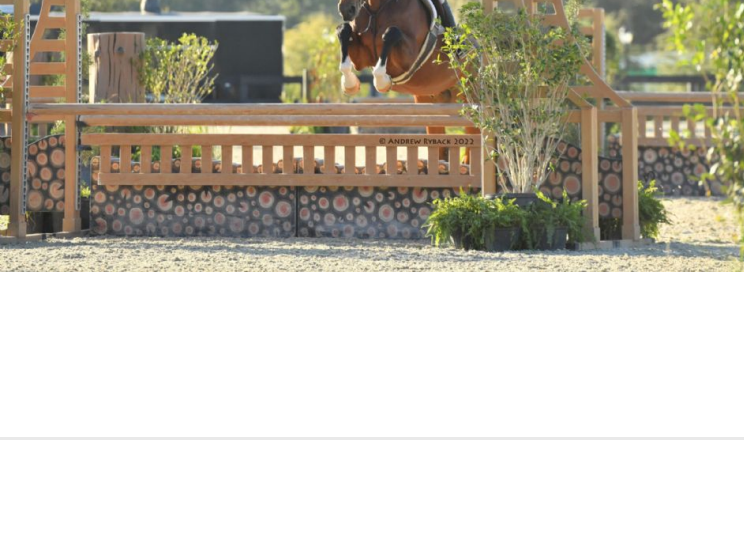

“I just went for it in the jump-off. I did six strides instead of the seven to the one-stride, which no one else did in the jump-off. I felt like I really had to slow him down for the seven in the first round, and I felt like he was very careful today so I was not worried about him having the rail in the combination.”

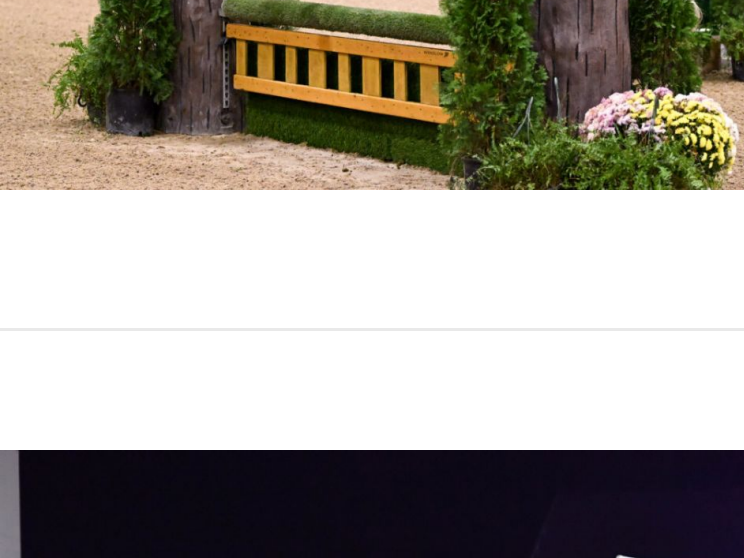

Grace Debney and Attendu de Lannois Z, owned by Ashland Farms, earned the top prize in the \$12,500 WEC – Ocala 3'6"-3'9" Hunter Derby. The pair received impressive scores of 92 and 90.5.

“My plan was to not out handy myself. I spoke with Liz [Reilly] before I went in and she told me to focus on consistency because it was my first time riding him. I ended up doing a few inside turns but nothing too crazy because we were ahead, and didn't want to risk anything.”

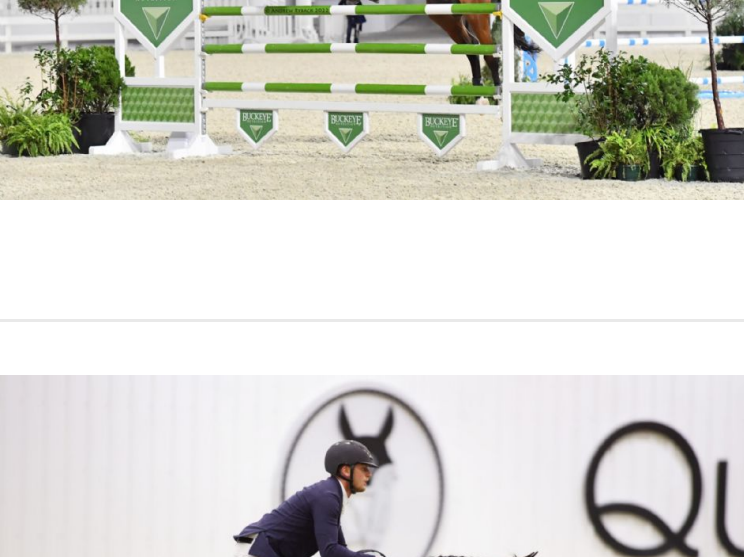

“She is my son's horse and I have never shown her. It took me a few jumps to figure out what to do but the less you do the better she is. It was very fun to do this today.”

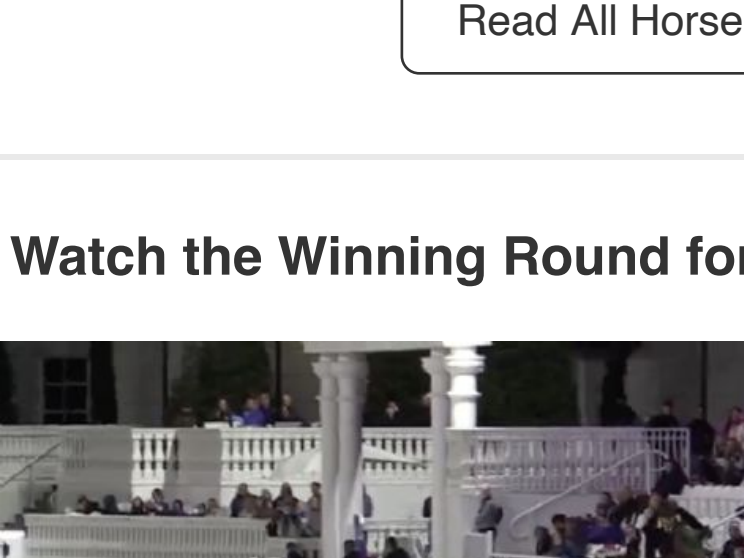

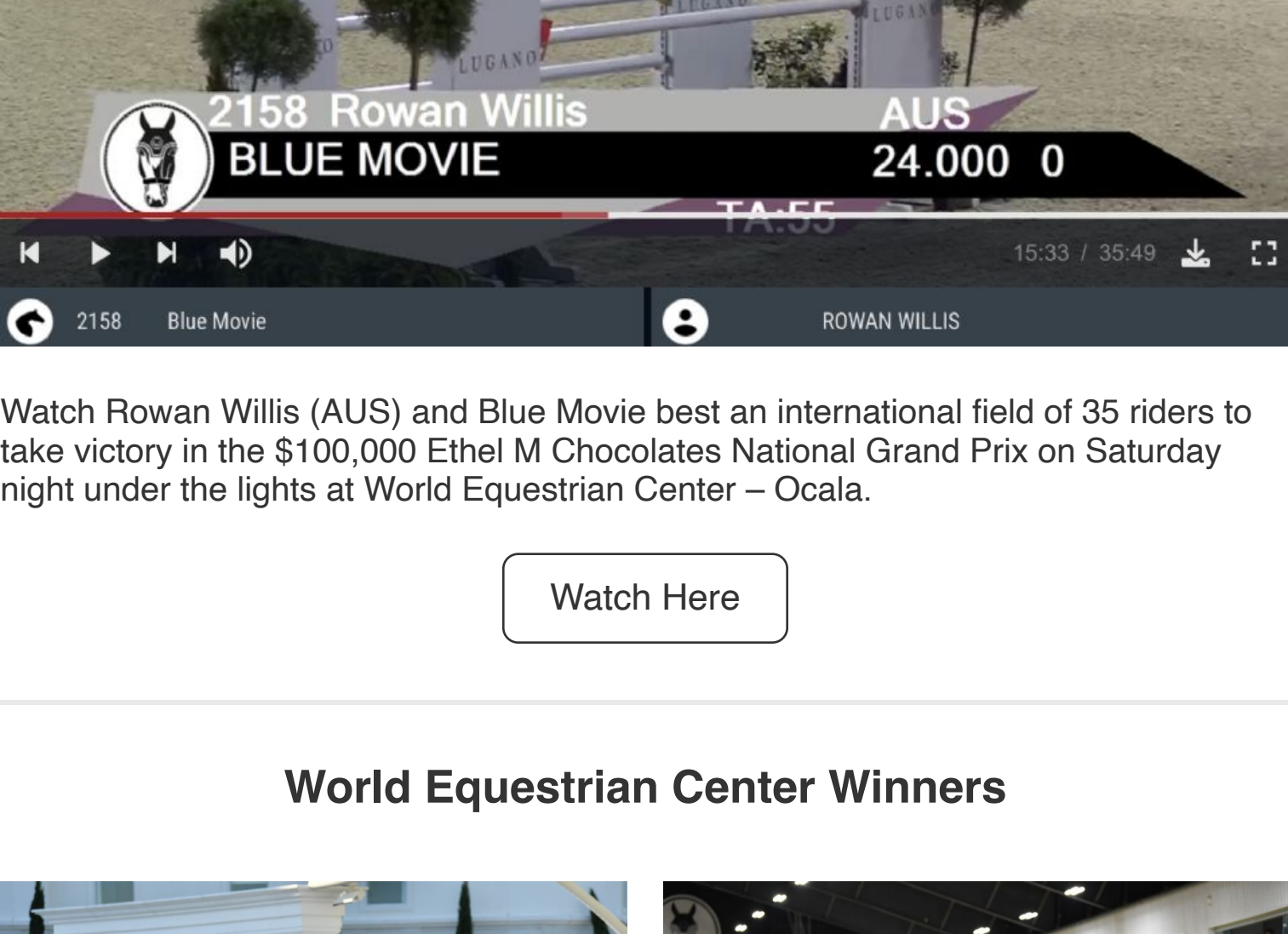

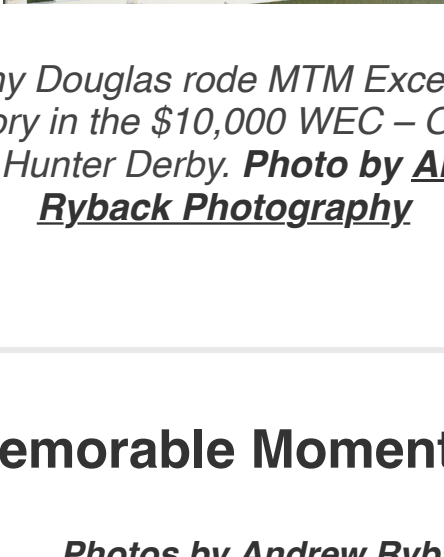

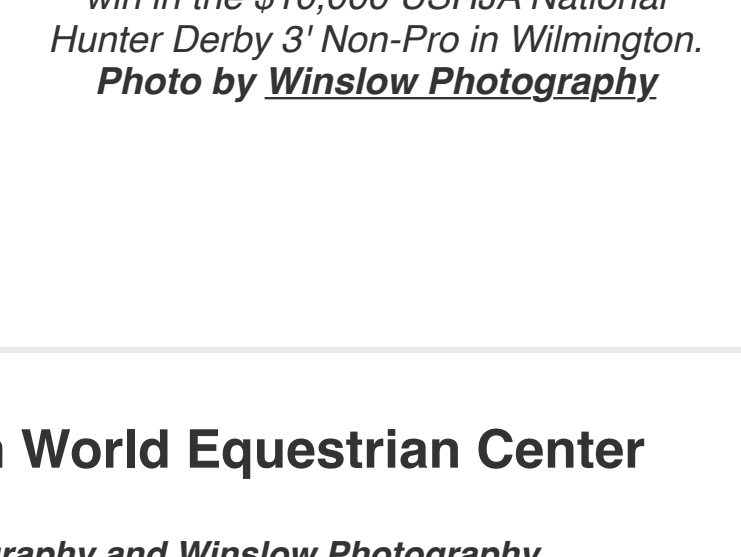

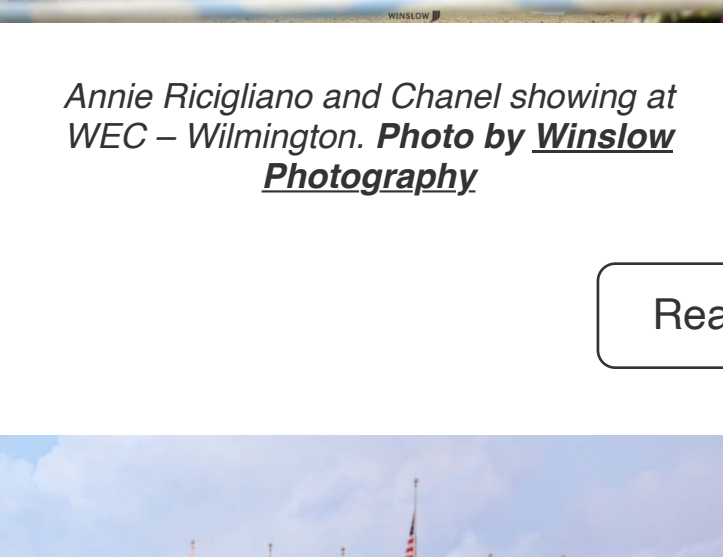
