2022 ROYAL HORSE SHOW—Toronto, Ontario

The Royal Horse Show, held as part of the iconic Royal Agricultural Winter Fair, celebrated its 100th anniversary November 4–12, 2022, in Toronto, Canada. This year's event featured an elevated CSI5*-W FEI rating, offered more than \$1 million in prize money and hosted riders from 11 countries, including three of the top 10 in the Longines World Rankings. Ireland's **Daniel Coyle** and **Legacy**, owned by **Ariel Grange** of Canada, were victorious in the coveted \$250,000 Longines FEI Jumping World Cup™ Toronto in front of a sold-out crowd of more than 7,000 spectators. Daniel and Legacy were the only pair to produce double-clear rounds over the track set by Canadian course designer **Michel Vaillancourt** to take the win over **Daniel Bluman** of Israel and Canada's own **Tiffany Foster**. Staying true to its tradition of excellence, The Royal entertained audiences with a blockbuster schedule of competition across a variety of disciplines including hunters, jumpers, equitation and heavy horses, as well as daily performances of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) Musical Ride.
