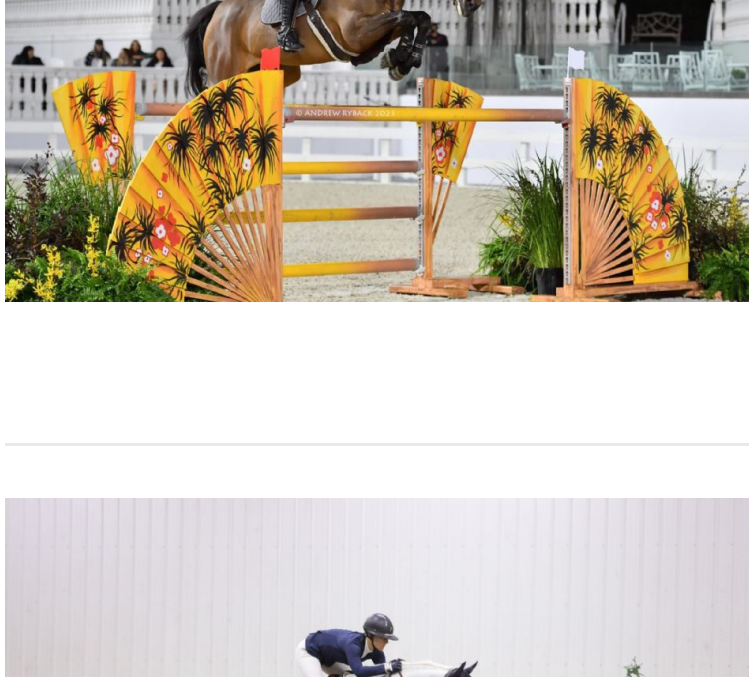

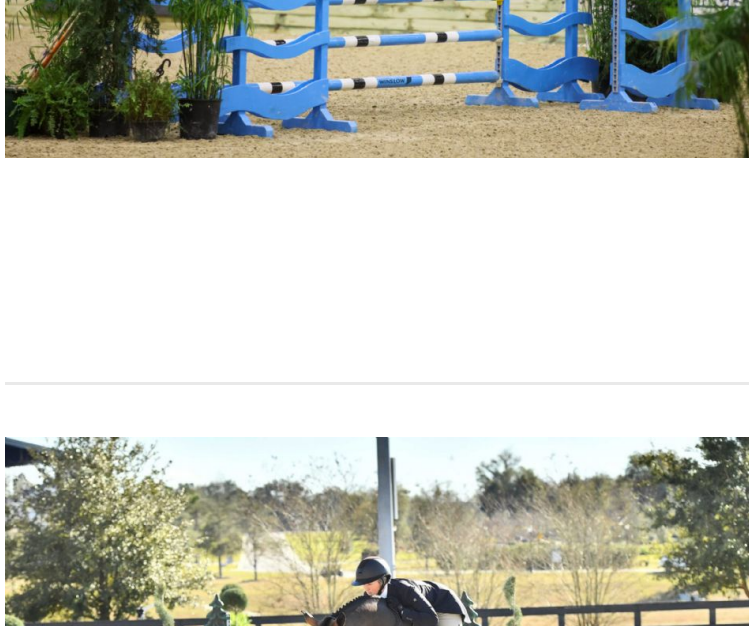
## World Equestrian Center Highlights From Ocala Winter Spectacular I and Wilmington Winter in the Midwest IV

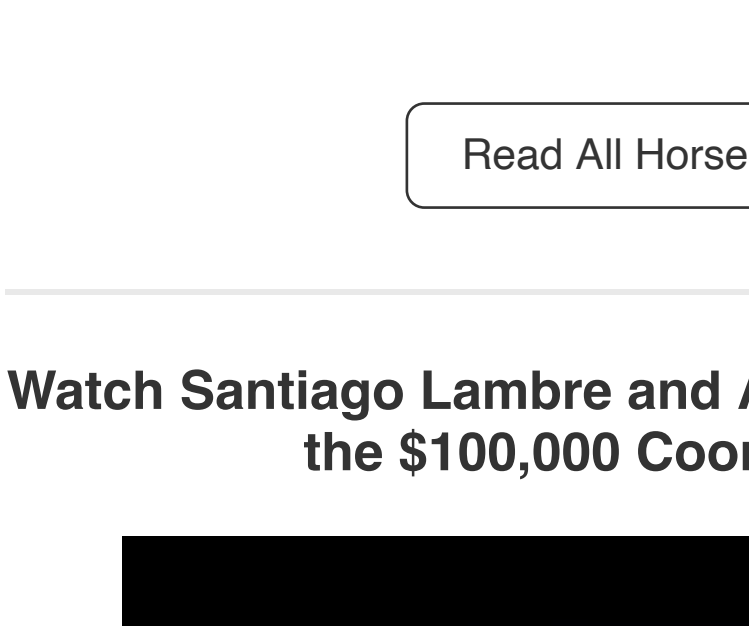

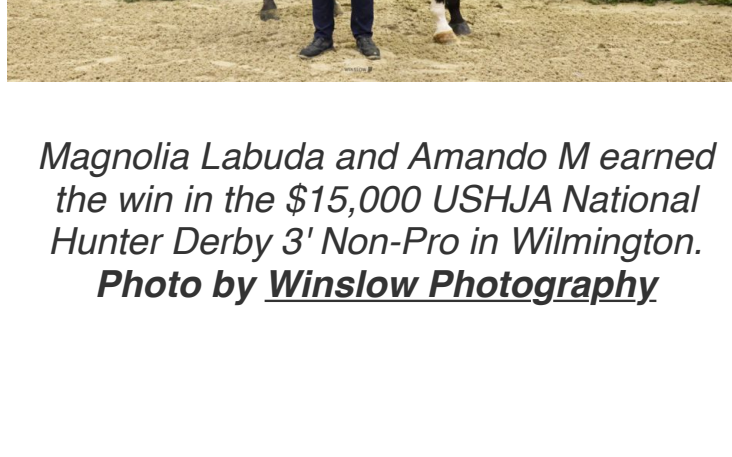

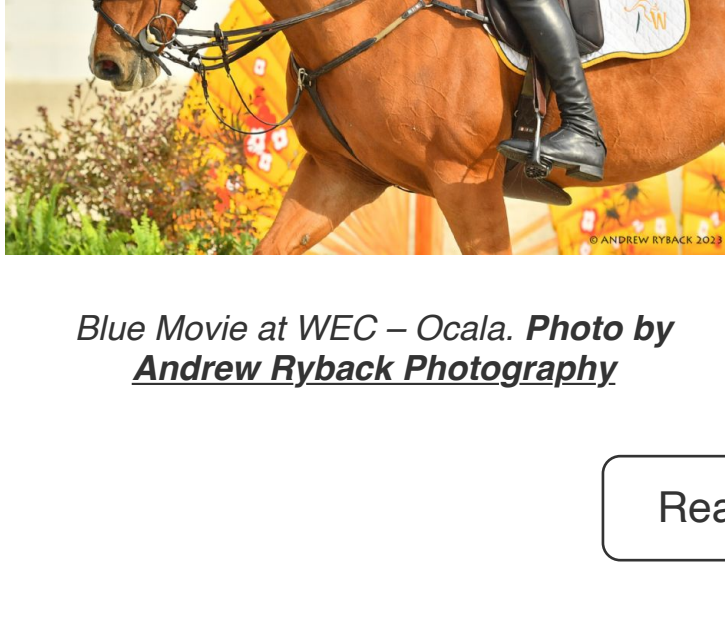
