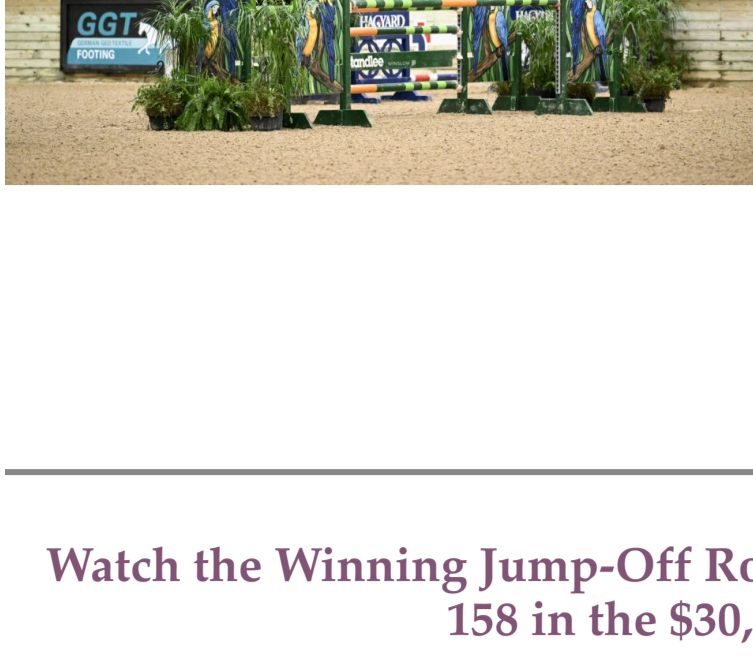

Wilmington Winter Classic VII

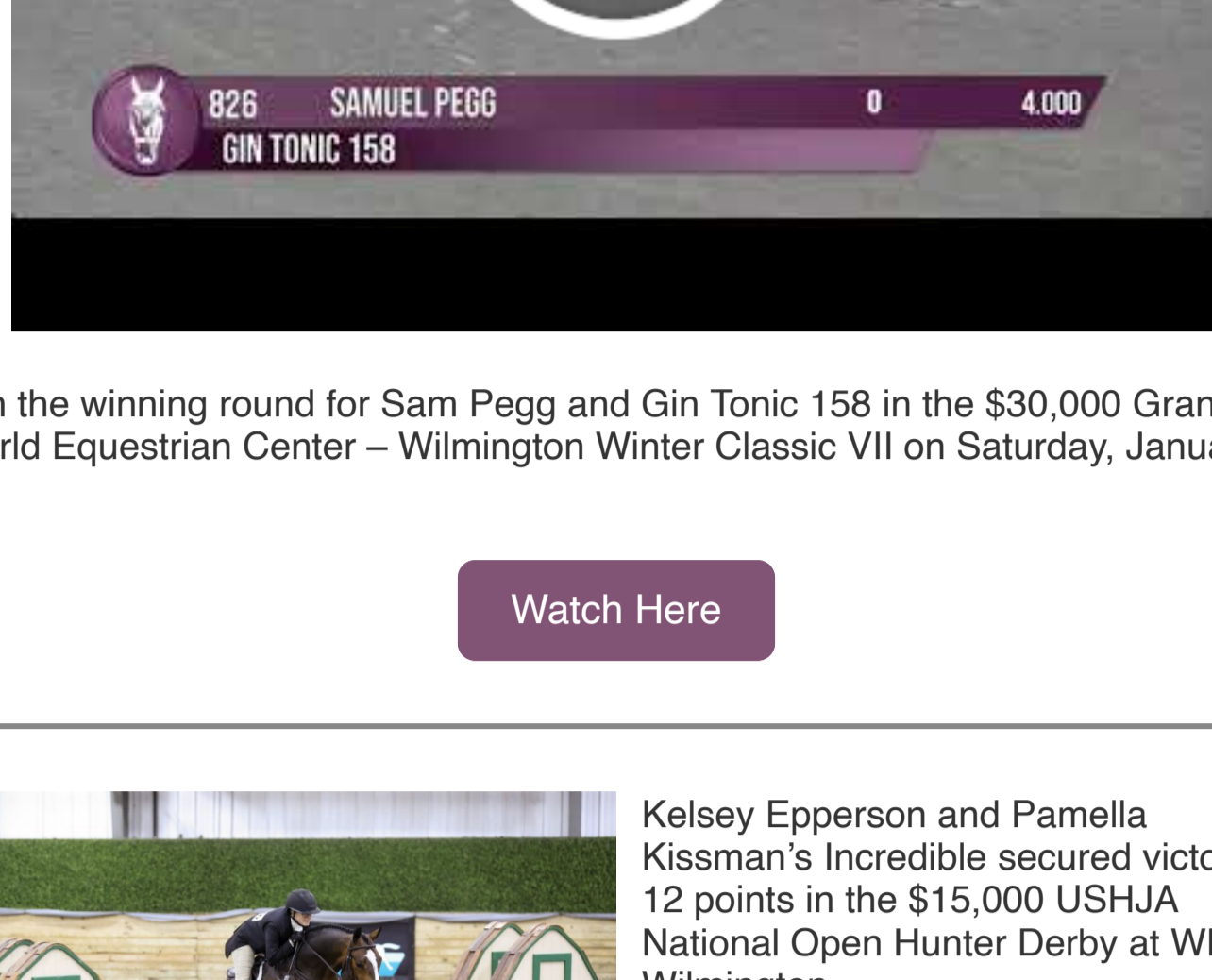

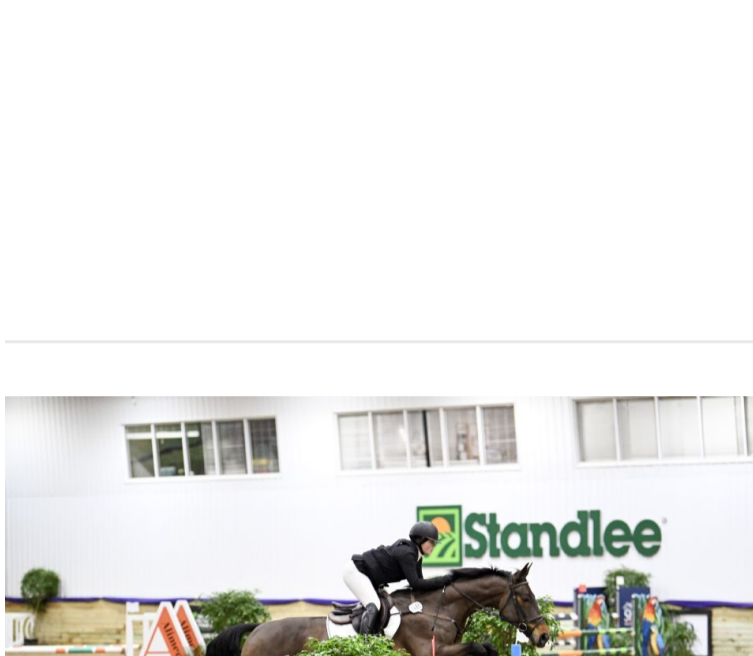

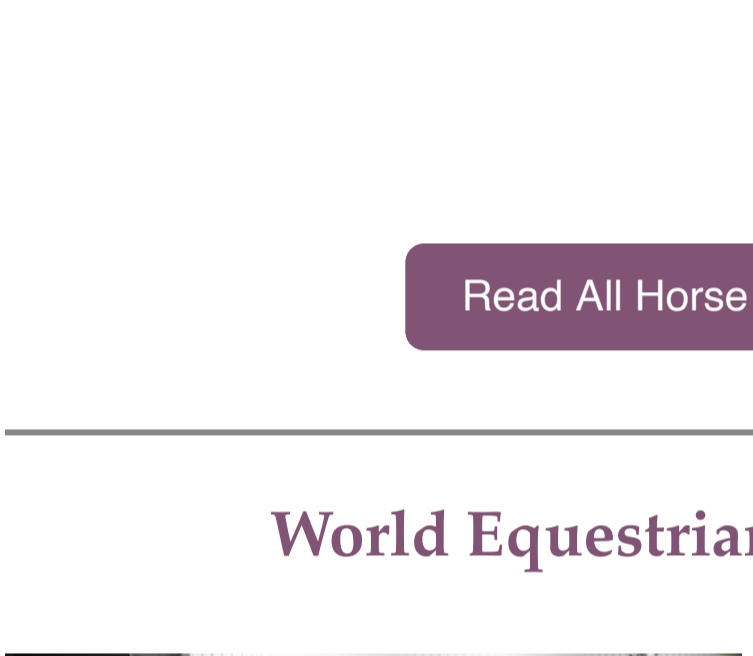
Ocala Winter Spectacular IV

"This is my third show with him, and he's been pretty fun to ride. We are just getting the partnership together and building up. He's a cheeky character, but when he gets in the ring he's all business."

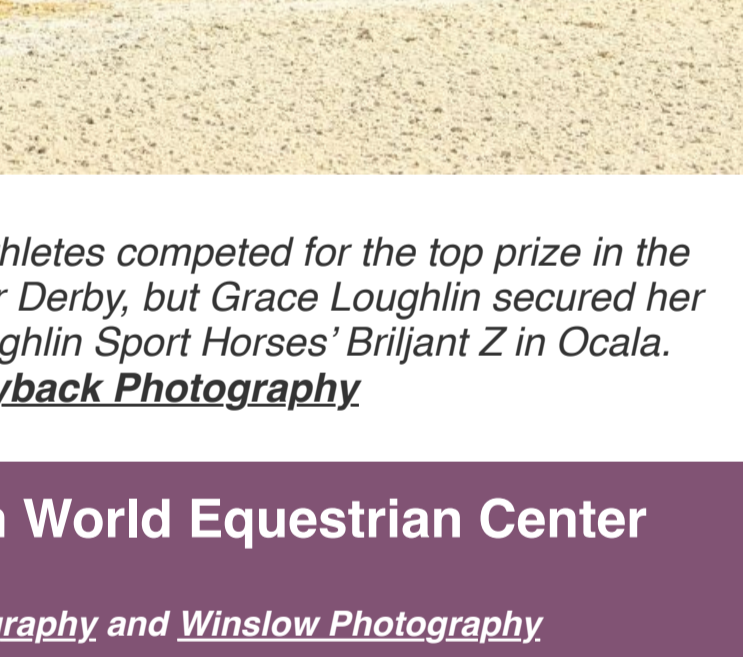

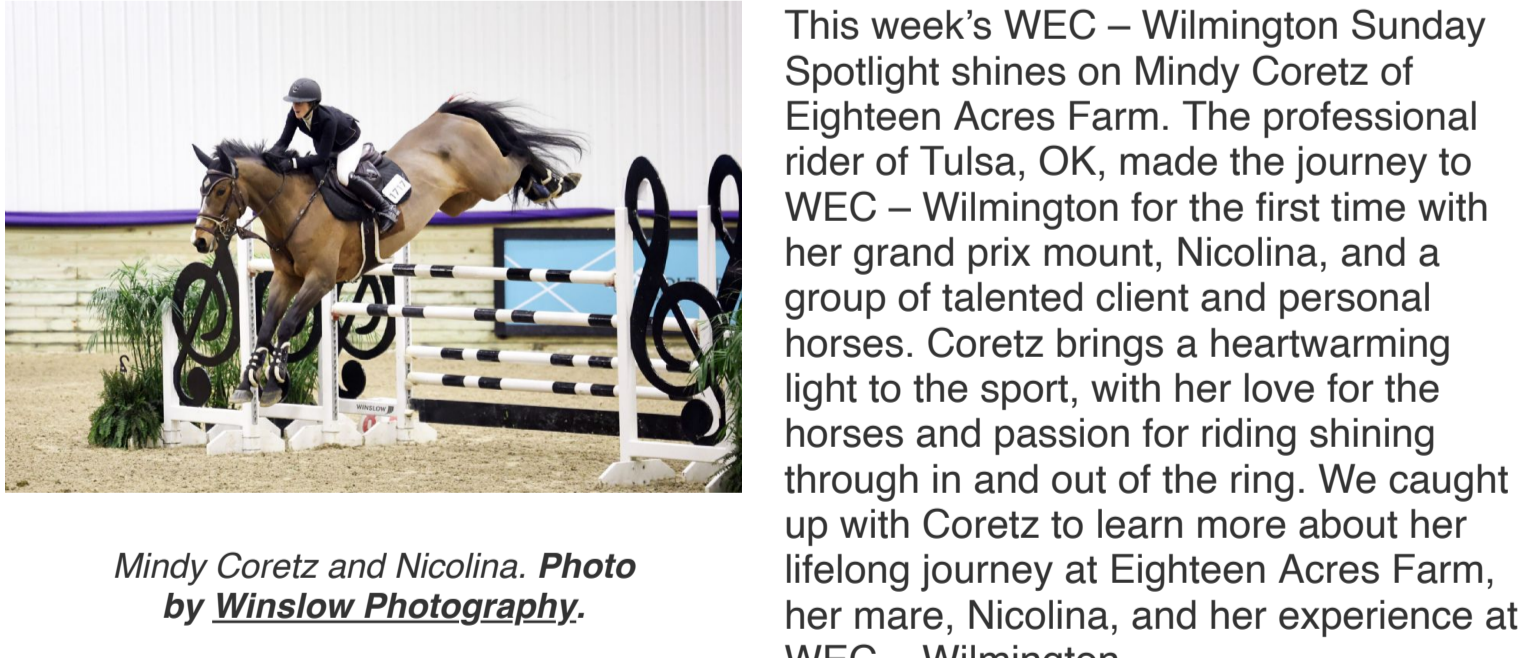

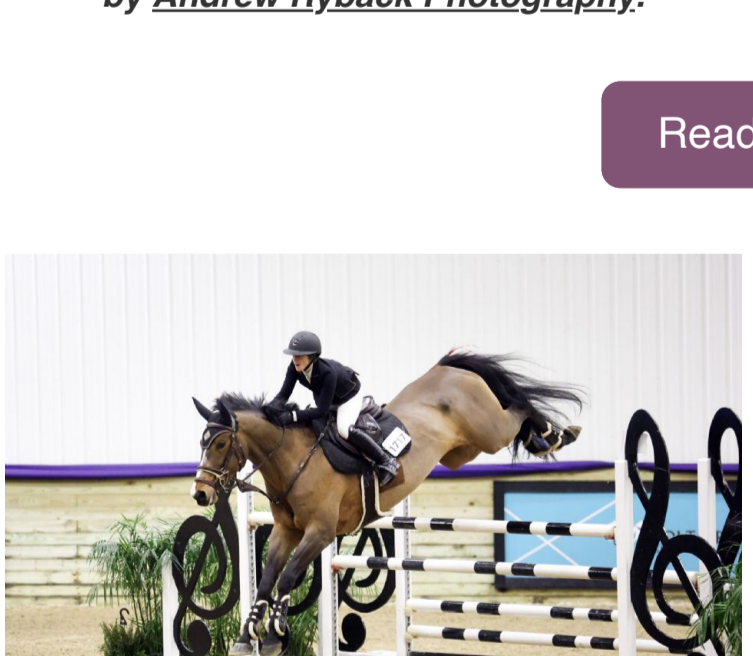
