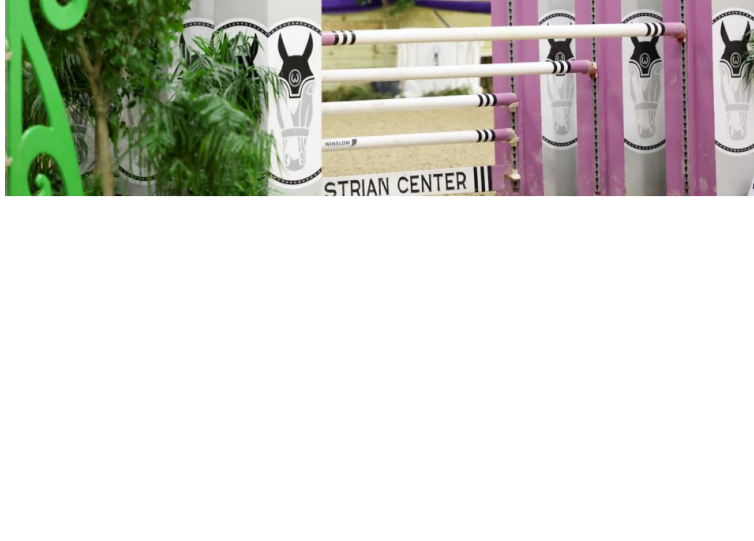

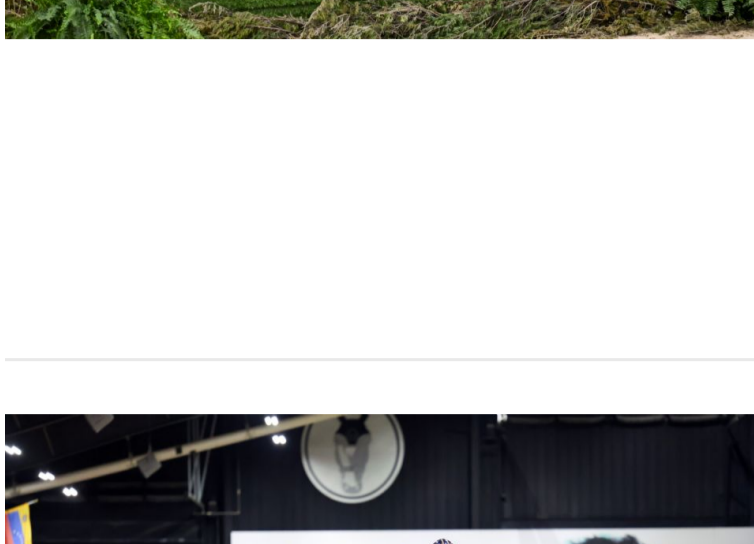
Wilmington Winter Classic XV



Amy Krebs (USA) proved unbeatable once again with her top mount Jabantos in the \$30,000 [Ohio State University Galbreath Equine Center Grand Prix](#) at WEC – Wilmington.

"I saw that Sarah's time was two seconds faster than my fastest one. I walked down the ramp on Elijah [Jabantos] and heard everyone cheering and I knew I had to do the leave out in the first line. It was the one spot where I knew I could make up the time. Again, I trust this horse so much and I knew he could do it, and he did it very well!"

Ocala Winter Spectacular XII

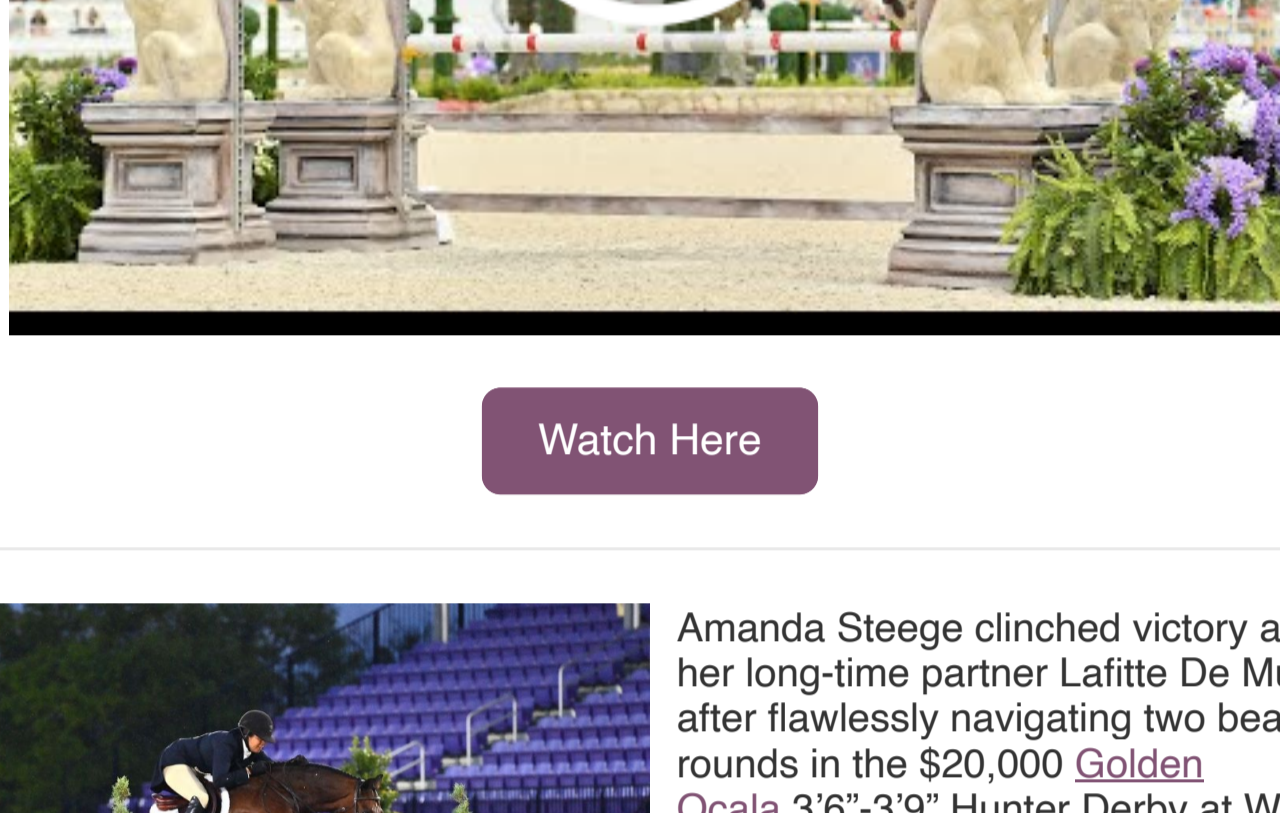

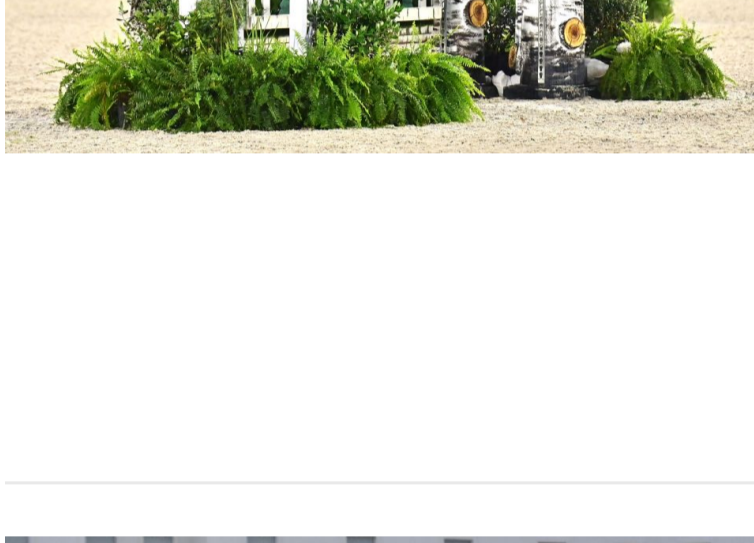

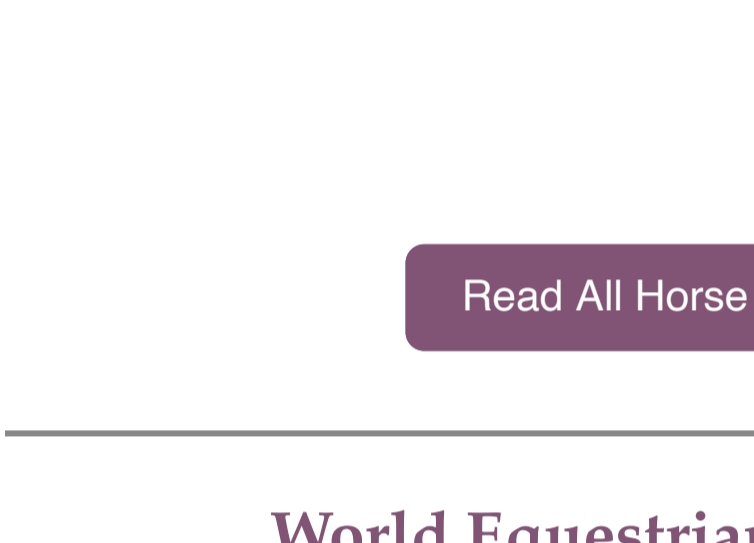

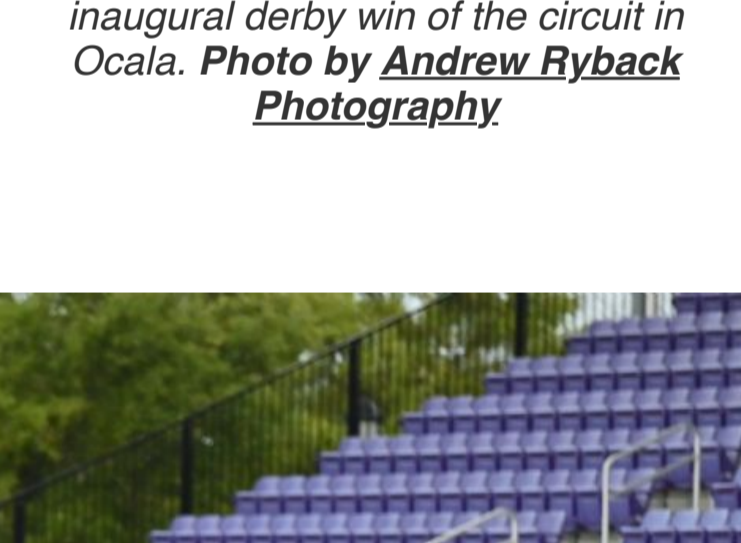

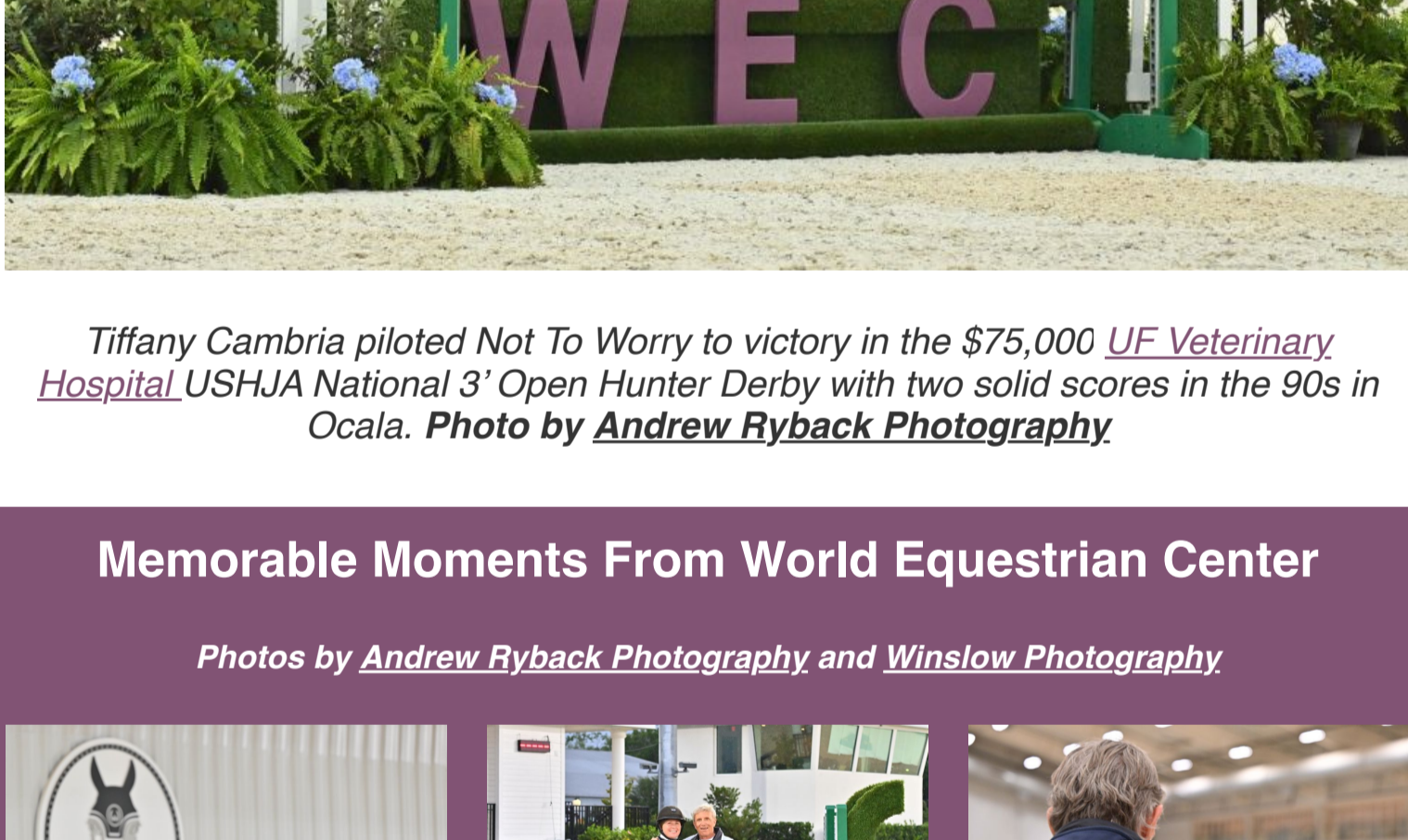

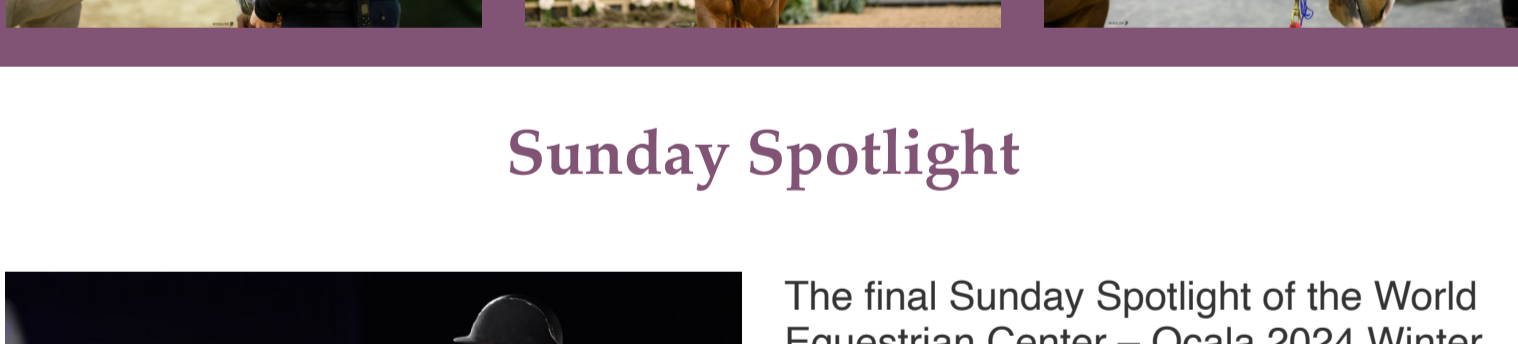

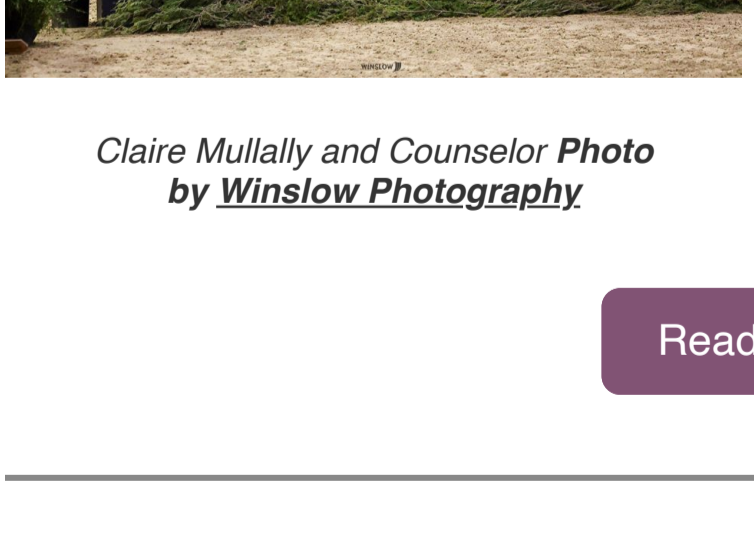
Sunday Spotlight

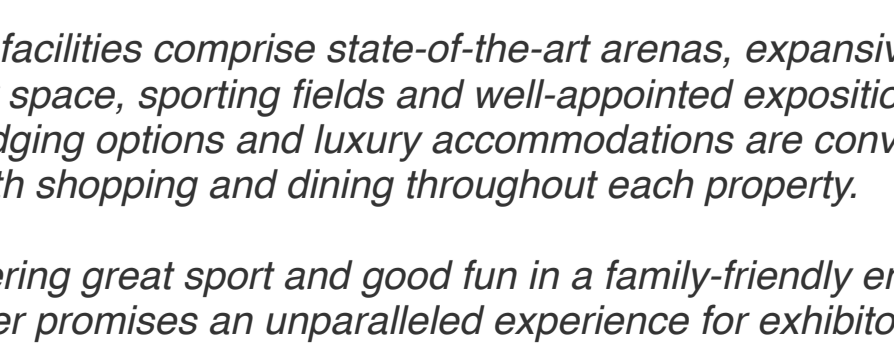
