

### Lauren Nicholson: A Journey From Natural Horsemanship to the Olympics

It was 1987 in southern Illinois when an eventing superstar was born. Lauren Nicholson's parents were accustomed to seeing horses throughout their neighborhood, but they knew nothing about equestrian sport at the elite level. When Lauren was six years old, they helped her pursue lessons at a local stable, but they had no idea how far those lessons would eventually take her. A passion was ignited that was so strong, it would drive her to help the United States claim the team gold medal at the 2015 Pan American Games in Toronto, Canada, and go on to compete at the 2016 Rio de Janeiro Olympic Games.

"It was purely happenstance that I started in an eventing barn and that was the sport I got hooked on," said Lauren.

### Irene Neuwirth's California Animal House

With a schedule to be reckoned with, at 41 Georgina Bloomberg — the younger daughter of Mayor Bloomberg – bears many roles as philanthropist, animal activist, competitive equestrian, author, and mother. She began riding at the age of four, competing just two years later and taking home many prestigious awards throughout her childhood and teen years. By the time she was 21 she decided to ride professionally. Her long list of accolades includes winning the Maxine Beard Award in 2004, the WEF Challenge Cup in 2007, the Empire State Grand Prix in 2010, and representing the U.S. Equestrian Team at the 2015 Pan American Games in Toronto, Canada, where she earned a Team Bronze medal.

When you arrive in Irene Neuwirth's neighborhood in La Quinta, CA, it's immediately clear which home belongs to the jewelry designer, who is known for her command of color. Hers is the only property in view that is not beige brick with beige stucco accents. Ignoring the strictures of the homeowner association, she painted the one-story house a soothing Spanish white. Sage-toned shutters blend into a cactus garden that replaced a green lawn. The association's board has complained only mildly. Her equine companions, on the other hand, don't mind at all. They are Coconut Grove, Scout's Honor, Guess Who, Guess Again, and Mango, and they are Neuwirth's Dutch Warmblood horses. She bought the house two years ago to be near them.



# **A BIT OF GOOD NEWS**



In April 2023, Days End Farm Horse Rescue (DEFHR), in Woodbine, MD, responded to a request from Carroll County Animal Control to take in seven neglected horses from a private farm in their community. The owner of the horses was no longer able to provide adequate care and agreed to forfeit the equines to DEFHR.

One of the horses taken in by DEFHR was a 14.2hh Arabian mare named Callista who was around 14 years old. Though DEFHR frequently treats severely neglected horses that require critical care and a robust rehabilitation program, Callista was in a stable condition and only required basic maintenance to bring her back to full health.



THE PLAID HORSE




Horses can injure themselves when you least expect it – sometimes even when they are not being exercised. That was the case for amateur rider Kelly Berry, who is based in Georgia, and her 13-year-old Thoroughbred gelding Sunny. Unfortunately, Sunny suffered a lateral collateral ligament injury in the pasture, necessitating eight months of rest. Berry thought they had done everything necessary to help Sunny return to shining form, but after coming back into work, Sunny was not able to stay consistently sound for longer than a month or two at a time.
