

Upcoming Competitions The Saratoga Classic Horse Shows are next on the schedule for White Hollow Farm. The Saratoga Classic I and II shows are USEF National-rated and Jumper Level 4. The Saratoga Classic I show will be the first World Championship Hunter Rider (WCHR) week of the season and will also include a \$10,000 USHJA International Hunter Derby and a \$5,000 USHJA National Hunter Derby.
