Eight horse-and-rider pairs from the United States, Australia, Argentina and Brazil advanced to a clear first round, but only two managed a double clear effort.

"He's a real fighter. I think he knows the sport already and knows how to jump clear. We haven't quite figured out the bit yet, but he has a lot of promise. I've been bringing him up for more than a year now, and he's got a pretty good track record of clear rounds."


Jennifer Tate and her longtime partner Carsten S, owned by Barbara Kravetz, claimed the top prize in the \$10,000 UF




