### Wilmington Fall V



Francisco Goyoaga Mollet (ESP) and The Diamant Rose Z were one of two to jump a double-clear effort to claim their second featured win of the week in the final \$60,000 [GGT Footing](#) Grand Prix of the 2024 Fall Classic Series.

“This is a horse that I have had for about three years now. She is a crazy-fast horse, and she has already won so many classes with the other rider that had her. She is so competitive, and makes it easy and fun to win classes!”



Speed was the name of the game in the \$10,000 Merck Futures Prix when eight combinations proceeded to the jump-off phase, though none could catch Izzy Beisel and her own Diaz Barbotiere.

“When I came out of the welcome on Thursday, I had the winning time by three seconds but had the last rail down. I felt like I needed to go slower in the jump-off because it always comes to the last rail. Toward the end of the course, I was really trying to slow down, but Diaz is just so fast.”



In the \$15,000 [GGT Footing](#) USHJA National Hunter Derby, Tammy Provost impressed with Angela Pietig Brown’s Mariner, securing their second career derby win together.

“This is only his third derby, and he has won two of them! He was very green when we first got him, so this is a huge victory. Angela was able to go from the 2’6” to the 3’ because he has grown up a lot. He has just liked my program, and it has all worked really well. We love him, and he is a really special horse.”



The \$12,000 [Sport Horse Insurance Group](#) 3’6”-3’9” Hunter Derby stole the show Friday afternoon, where Havens Schatt partnered up with her old derby mount, Cascartini, to take the win.

Having imported the now 12-year-old Holsteiner gelding as a seven-year-old, Schatt was happy to return to the derby ring with ‘Marty,’ “It was really fun today! I knew they had this class here, and we wanted to show him in it. He is so scopey, and it is so easy for him. I know him so well that riding and showing him is just like putting on a glove.”
