March 6, 2026 – Wellington, FL – The U.S. Jumping Team delivered an outstanding performance on Saturday night, February 28, 2026, capturing top honors in the FEI Nations Cup team competition during the Winter Equestrian Festival (WEF) in Wellington, Florida.

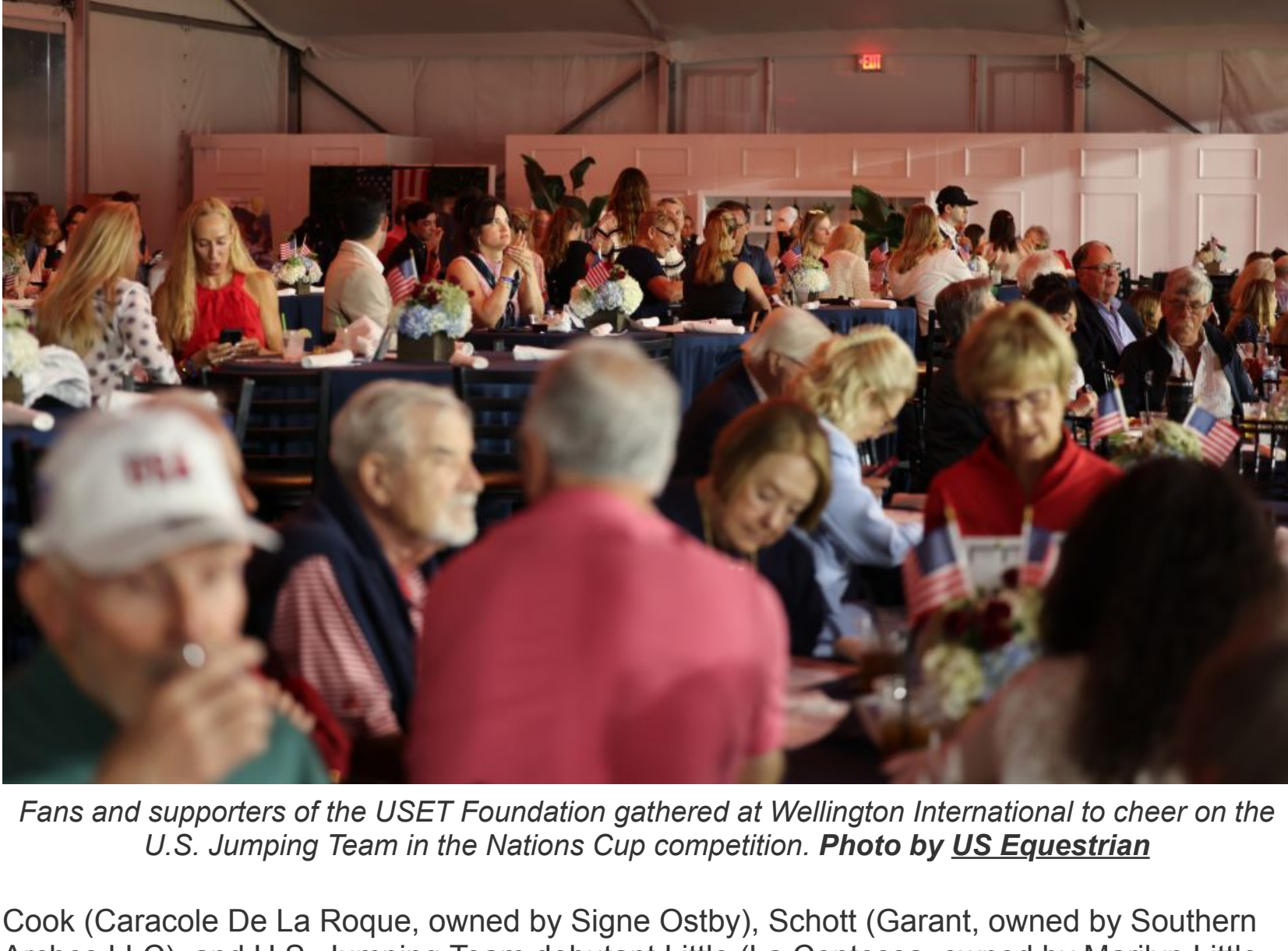
Backed by a sea of red, white, and blue throughout the arena — and an enthusiastic United States Equestrian Team (USET) Foundation and US Equestrian watch party — the team of Karl Cook, Marilyn Little, Callie Schott, and McLain Ward rose to the occasion.

Competing under the lights, the U.S. squad earned the stars-and-stripes team its second consecutive victory in the prestigious FEI Jumping Nations Cup Wellington CSIO4*. Over the 25-year history of the Wellington leg of the FEI Nations Cup, the U.S. has taken the top spot on the podium 11 times.

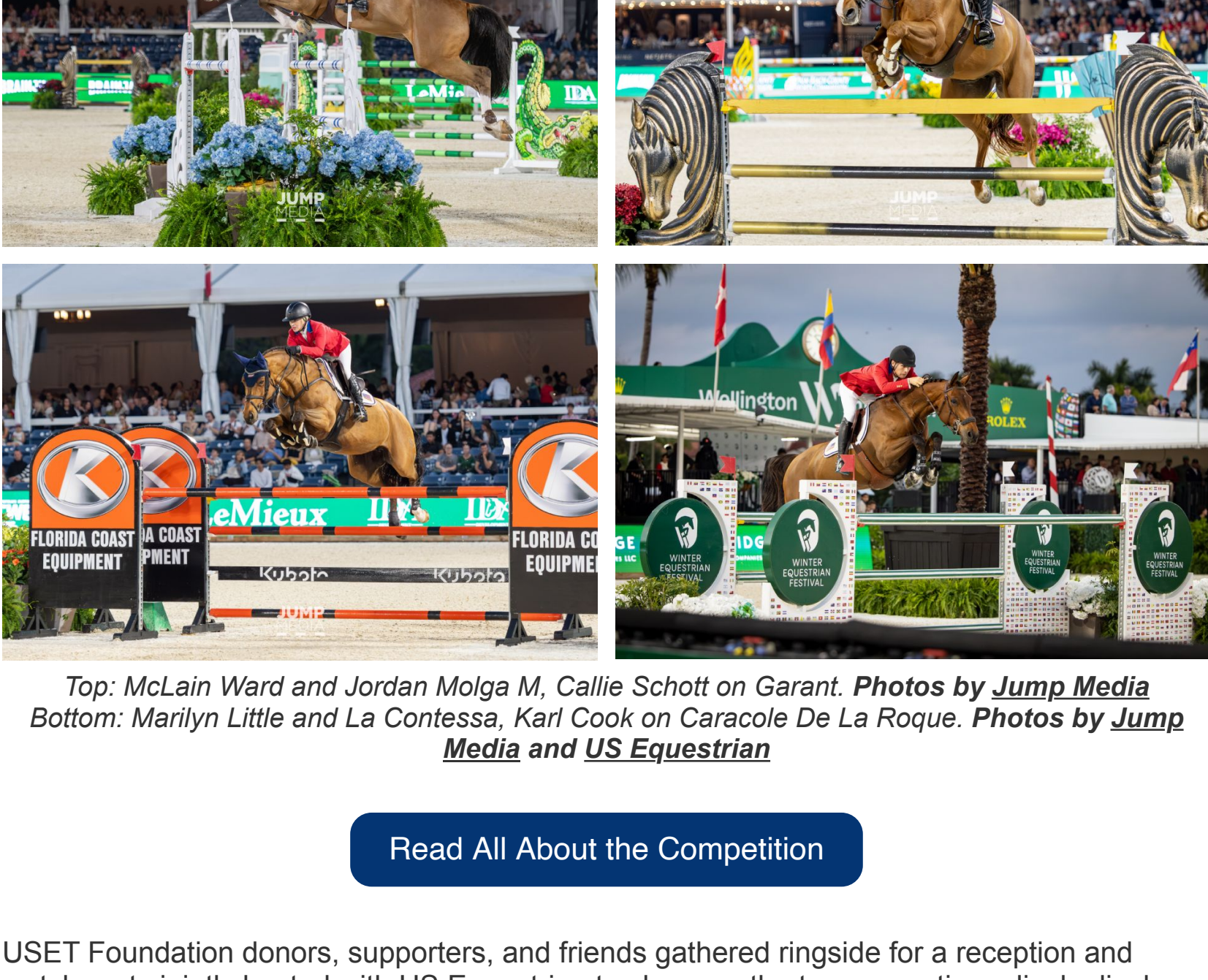
"This is always a very interesting Nations Cup for us because the pressure is on," said U.S. Jumping Chef d'Equipe Robert Ridland. "It's a home Nations Cup, and it's a big deal for us. It's a great event, and every year you really feel the support and the energy from the crowd and the atmosphere."

Cook (Caracole De La Roque, owned by Signe Ostby), Schott (Garant, owned by Southern Arches LLC), and U.S. Jumping Team debutant Little (La Contessa, owned by Marilyn Little LLC) all jumped clear in the opening round. Ridland elected to save Ward's horse, Michael Smith's Jordan Molga M, for the second round. Ultimately, it was a clear round from Ward and his newer mount that secured the U.S.'s win on a stellar night after being tied on four faults with Ireland as Ward made his way into the ring.

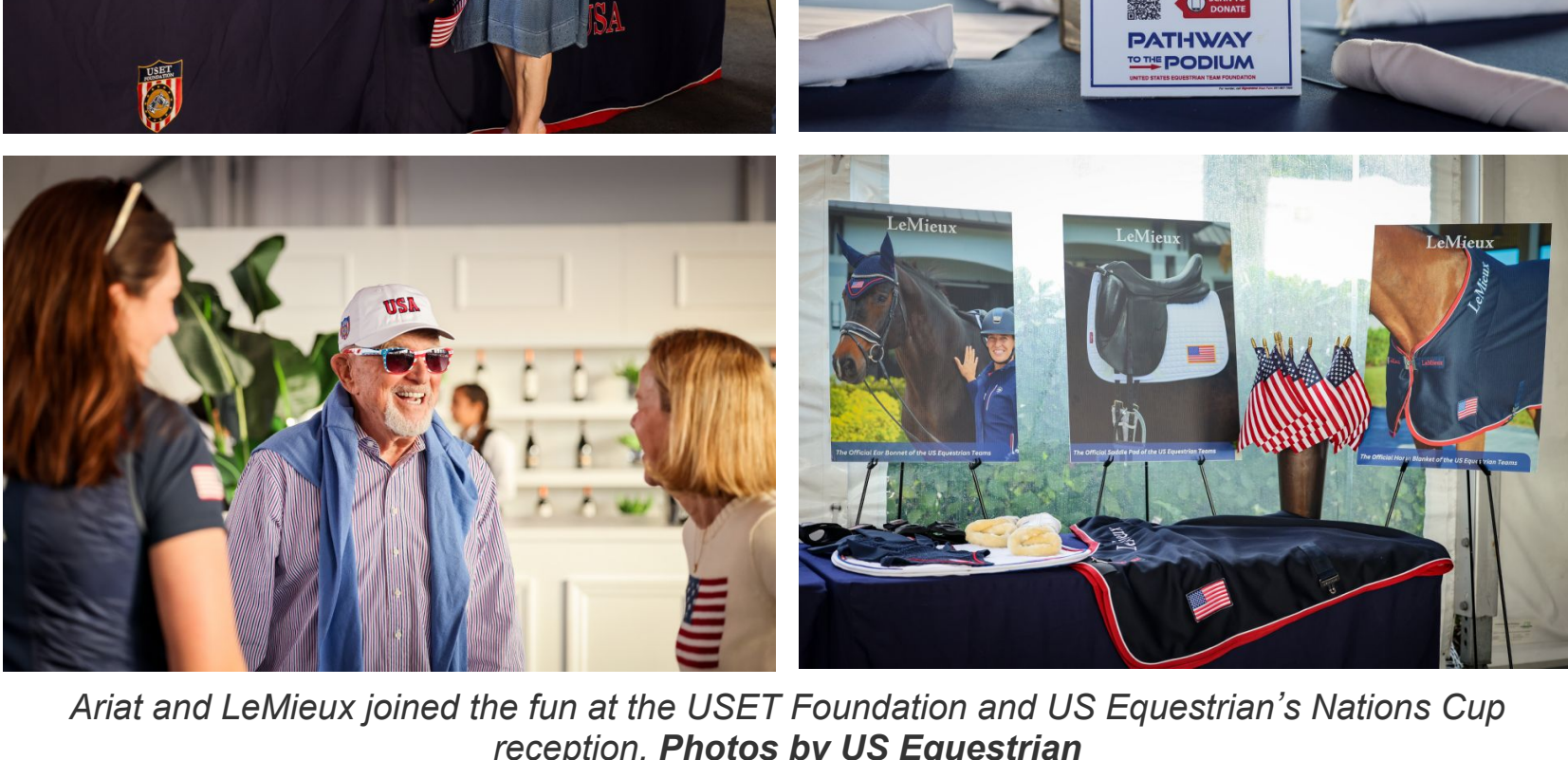
"I'm very lucky to have such a strong team — they put me in a pretty nice position," said Ward. "It's always a good feeling knowing you're going to either jump off or win."
